SEPTEMBER START UP - TENATIVE OUTLINE

Similar to the last few years, we need to wait until our enrolment settles before going into "permanent" classes. This may take a few weeks (give or take, depending on how many new students have registered). As of right now, our plan for September is as follows:

Tuesday, September 2 - all returning students report to their 2023-2024 classroom; new students report to the library. (*Note: 2 hour early dismissal (12:13pm) on Tuesday, September 3*

Wednesday, September 3 - all Grade 1-7 students will report to their temporary group:

- Grade 1s and 2s meet by the PAC/gym doors (green wall)
- Grade 3s and 4s meet in the library
- Grade 5s, 6s, 7s meet in the gym (please enter via the basketball court)
- NOTE: New Kindergarten Students will be on a Gradual Entry Schedule (see separate Kindergarten email)

Thursday, September 4 until further notice (hopefully not too long!) - all Grade 1-7 students will report to the same temporary group ("Home Base") each morning and be dismissed from the same place each day until our enrollment and staffing is finalized. *Temporary* Groups were created alphabetically; teachers will mix the groups up throughout the days, but students will start (8:30am) and end (2:13pm) each day with the same *Temporary* Group (and the same location!) each day.

At Discovery, We C.A.R.E.

CELL PHONES and PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES

As you may recall, back in the spring, the Ministry of Education and Childcare announced new guidelines around cellphone use in schools. Specifically, "Boards must ensure their codes of conduct include one or more statements about restricting the use of personal digital devices at school. The Provincial Standards for Codes of

Conduct Order has been amended to require Boards of Education to ensure their codes of conduct include statements about restricting the use of personal digital devices to:

- Reduce distractions in classrooms and support focused learning environments
- Foster online safety, and
- Promote provincial consistency"

To comply with these expectations, we first ask families to encourage students to leave their cellphones at home. Each classroom has a landline phone, in case students need to get in touch with their families during the day, and the office staff is more than happy to take messages for students, should families need to get in touch with students during the day.
